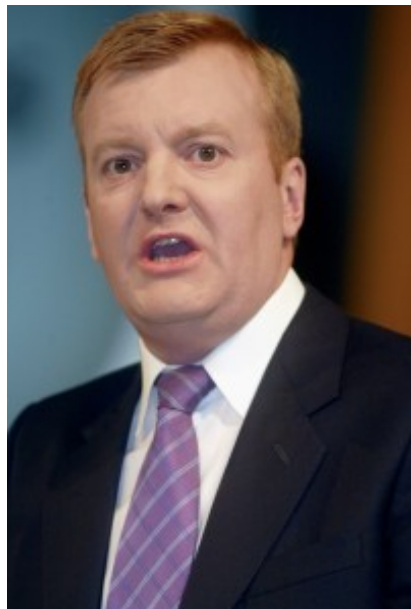

Support for the Liberal Democrats among students has rocketed, a new poll finds.

Some 47 per cent of students have decided to be compared to 23 per cent opting for Labour and 2 Conservatives, the Times Higher Education Supp

The figure is up eight points since February.

Labour is down six percentage points.

Among university lecturers and academics, 44 pe planned to vote for the Lib Dems, double the nur OpinionPanel Research poll found.
